Iceland, as the motion giver, gave a speech about the problems caused by Artificial Intelligence in everyday life, and how it needs to be used efficiently by governments. Most of the countries agreed, and while some of them focused more on the negative aspects of AI usage, the others saw the positive aspects to be more important. From the ones that mentioned the negative aspects to be more crucial, the proposal of finding a solution mostly came from countries like UK, USA, France and Russia. France also referred to transparency and data safety to be as an important issue and emphasized that it could cause ethical concerns among citizens.

In the next session, delegates continued with their speeches. Although the unemployment issue was raised before, it was discussed once again by Estonia and Albania and the speeches were over. While most countries talked about the advantages and disadvantages AI causes to a country and its citizens, only some of the countries proposed raising awareness, educating people, and making new regulations as possible or already in progress solutions.

The fifth session began with another motion from India to discuss the usage of AI in law. India continued with his speech and stated that the usage of AI was beneficial in the field of law.

Other delegates defended it could also help doctors diagnose patients faster, and that it didn't have to be at the center of the treatment or any surgery. Another point was made by China that it would also be beneficial for the healthcare workers since their lives can be threatened most of the time, and AI could prevent them from taking the blame. In the last sessions, resolutions were written regarding the first agenda item. After the writing process was over, we continued with the GSL. Many delegates thanked everyone for their cooperation in writing the resolution papers. The second day ended to continue with the second agenda item on the third day.
